## More than 200 simultaneous premieres worldwide

**More than 200 simultaneous premiere screenings of The Thin Green Line are now registered worldwide.**

**It's estimated that more than 8000 people will view the documentary on July 31, International Rangers Day.**

Tickets are also selling fast for the 'Green Carpet Gala' at Melbourne's Astor Theatre.

The documentary features a great soundtrack with music from some of Australia's finest artists: including John Butler Trio, Xavier Rudd, Blue King Brown, Bomba and many more.

While the premiere is simultaneous and worldwide, Melbourne is very much the home of this project, and the grand old Astor Theatre is the July 31 site for The Thin Green Line's 'Green Carpet Gala'.

Opening this event will be Witiyana Marika - singer in the band Yothu Yindi and head of the Dhimurru Indigenous Protected Area in north-east Arnhem Land.

The Green Carpet Gala, will include a big screen showing of The Thin Green Line and six bands: Bomba, Symbiosis, Cousin Leonard, TOV, Paul Dillon, Josh Owen.

"We are hoping for more than 1000 people at The Astor event, but need Melbourne's support to achieve those numbers," said Sean Willmore.

Endorsing the project is The International Union of Conservation Nations (IUCN), World Commission on Protected Areas (WCPA) as well as the International Rangers Federation.
